Her latest album "People of the Earth and Sea" explores vivid narratives of faith, earth, and finding meaning in an ever-changing world. Her tour highlights include headlining renowned folk venue The Ark, as well as opening for The Accidentals at Ann Arbor's annual *Sonic Lunch* concert series.
